## AGENDA ITEMS

### Item 1.2: Chancellor's Office Update (*Eloy Ortiz Oakley and Dr. Daisy Gonzales*)

The Chancellor's Office (CO) presented updates on relevant developments and time-sensitive changes including items previously presented that may require additional consultation.

#### Discussion Summary:

- CSEA requested overall percentages of in-person and online classes.
- CO estimated 40% in-person, 60% online with more data in the fall semester.
- FACCC offered support regarding CO bandwidth.

- CO encouraged support in data, research capacity, cybersecurity, and AB 705.

### **Item 1.3: Student Senate Update** (*Angelica Campos and Jasmine Prasad*)

This item presented updates on the SSCCC current initiatives, legislative stances, system participation, and the status of the SSCCC Board of Directors.

#### **Discussion Summary:**

- None.

### **Item 1.4: State and Federal Update** (*Rebecca Ruan-O'Shaughnessy and David O'Brien*)

This item presented a State and Federal Update, encouraging Council members to engage in shared advocacy, and discussion on priority bills and budget proposals to advance the *Vision for Success*.

#### **Discussion Summary:**

- CCLC requested clarification on the CO's process of taking a position on legislation.
- CO explained the process emphasizing the importance of Councils input.
- FACCC thanked CO for engagement and communication on legislation. Requested follow up on legislation amendments.
- CCCI raised concerns surrounding transfer data.
- SSCCC expressed support for AB 1705 and clarified students' desire to be included in placement decisions.
- CCA/CTA requested clarity on the impact AB 1705 would have on student placement.
- ASCCC expressed their AB 1705 [opposition](https://asccc.org/sites/default/files/position-letters/Oppose_AB1705_as_of_April_19_2022.pdf) (https://asccc.org/sites/default/files/position-letters/Oppose\_AB1705\_as\_of\_April\_19\_2022.pdf).
- CSEA discussed emergency funds and the Governor Higher Education Road Map.
- ACBO requested clarification on AB 1705, specifically on calculus, math, and noncredit.
- CSSO raised concerns with remedial courses.

### **Item 1.5: Equitable Transfer Pathways - Update on System Priorities** (*Marty Alvarado and Dr. Lizette Navarette*)

This item provided an update and opportunity to discuss prioritization areas for Equitable Transfer Pathways for CCC students, a Council focus area identified at the October 2020 Special Session.

### **Discussion Summary:**

- CCA/CTA requested data on the different courses in the Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory (COCI) system.
- CO approximated 500,000 different courses.

### **Item 1.6: Governor's Office Intersegmental Basic Needs Report**

*(Marty Alvarado)*

This item provided an overview of the Intersegmental Basic Needs report, an initiative of the Governor's Council on Post-Secondary Education, for feedback from members of the Council.

### **Discussion Summary:**
