¹ The State funds shown in the attachment are used to finance specific phases of each project. These phases are designated by the following letters; Preliminary Plans (P), Working Drawings (W) Construction (C), and Equipment (E).

² Ready Access Program Projects–Projects that participate in the program receive lump-sum state funding for all project phases in one Budget Act appropriation. The goal of Ready Access Program is to save state bond dollars with no cost to the General Fund while allowing local community college districts the ability to complete their projects faster in order to address growth and modernization facility needs. The program saves the state money because a local contribution to offset state supportable costs is required in order for districts to participate in the program and shortens the period to complete projects by at least one budget cycle.
