SUBJECT: 2008-09 EOPS Unduplicated Headcount

Congratulations! The *2008-09 Chancellor's Office MIS Annual EOPS Students Served Report* shows that statewide the EOPS program served 112,733 students, an increase of approximately 4.5 percent over the previous year. The report was developed using data submitted by the districts to our agency's Management Information System (MIS) in August, 2009. The report lists each college's unduplicated headcount of eligible EOPS students served during the 2008-09 academic year (including *summer and fall 2008, and winter and spring 2009*).

The data have been evaluated according to the following EOPS eligibility standards. The planned or enrolled number of units for new EOPS students should be full-time or equivalent at the time of acceptance into the program (Title 5, Section 56202). However, the EOPS Director may accept students enrolled three-quarter time (9 units per semester; 8 units per quarter), but this cannot exceed 10% of the total number of new EOPS students accepted during the academic year.

If the data submitted included new EOPS students with fewer than nine units for the fall and/or spring terms (except colleges on a quarter system), and fewer than four units for the summer and/or winter term, these students would not be recognized as *served* for the purpose of the EOPS allocation. (This does not apply to new EOPS students enrolled in Special Majors or students with a verifiable disability provided that the appropriate MIS data elements are completed).

The data for each college is reported on the attached table. The data reported in Column 2 on the attached table represents students who were reported as *served* and the number of planned units was consistent with EOPS eligibility standards. Column 3 of the attached table represents students that were excluded because the student did not meet EOPS eligibility standards.

The Chancellor's Office staff will assist you in identifying data discrepancies, but, once discovered, the district/college MIS staff will need to correct those discrepancies to ensure the accuracy of the data for future reports.
