



**15-DAY NOTICE OF MODIFICATIONS TO TEXT OF PROPOSED  
AMENDMENTS TO CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS, TITLE 5  
REGARDING  
CHANCELLOR'S EMERGENCY AUTHORITY**

**15-Day Notice published September 2, 2020**

The Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges hereby provides notice of changes to the above-referenced proposed regulatory action that was the subject of a public hearing on July 20, 2020. Section 206, subdivision (c), of the Procedures and Standing Orders of the Board of Governors requires the Board to re-notice a proposed regulatory action where the proposed regulations have been previously considered, are being modified, and the modifications are "sufficiently related" to the text of the previously-proposed regulations.

**CHANGES TO THE TEXT**

Following the 45-day comment period that ended on August 17, 2020, and following the July 20, 2020 Board meeting, changes were made to this regulatory action in proposed section 52020. The California Community College Chancellor's Office will present the regulatory action to the Board of Governors at its September 21, 2020 meeting. The changes are submitted for an additional 15-day comment period effective today, September 2, 2020. Comments must be received prior to 4:00 p.m. on September 17, 2020.

The Chancellor's Office proposes additional changes to the proposed regulatory action. The changes from the original noticed regulations are denoted by double bold underline and/or double bold strikeout, as indicated below.

Title 5, section 52020, subdivisions (a),(b) and (d):

- (a) During a period of emergency proclaimed by the Governor of the State of California, the Chancellor may assume emergency

authority upon a **written** finding, made in consultation with the President **and the Vice President** of the Board of Governors that the emergency will result in substantial disruption to the educational mission of one or more California community colleges or college districts. The Chancellor's emergency authority may be exercised on a local, regional, or statewide basis, according to the circumstances of the declared emergency, and must be directed toward maintaining the continuity of educational services.

(b)The Chancellor's emergency authority includes, but is not limited to, the issuance of executive orders, for any of the following purposes:

- (1) to suspend temporarily regulations adopted by the Board, or local rules and regulations, that are a barrier to the continuity of educational services; and
- (2) to establish temporary procedures governing the California Community Colleges to promote the continuity of educational services.

Emergency actions taken by the Chancellor must be approved by the President **and the Vice-President of the Board in writing.** ~~or by the Vice-President if the President is unavailable.~~ **Actions taken by the Chancellor under this authority must explain how the action maintains the continuity of educational services.**

(d)The Chancellor shall **promptly** report to the Board all actions taken under this section. Any emergency action taken by the Chancellor **shall be placed on a Board agenda within 120 days for ratification, amendment, or rejection by the Board.** ~~by may be amended or terminated by a resolution adopted by majority vote of the Board~~

## **WRITTEN COMMENT PERIOD**

Any interested person may submit written comments relevant to the changes to the proposed regulatory action subject to this 15-day notice. Comments must be limited to title 5, California Code of Regulations, section 52020. We will accept comments concerning the changes outlined above in this 15-day notice until September 17, 2020. ### **CHANGES OR MODIFICATIONS TO PROPOSED TITLE 5 AMENDMENTS**

Following the public hearing and considering all timely and relevant comments received, the Board of Governors may adopt the proposed regulations substantially as described in this Notice or may modify the proposed regulations if the modifications are sufficiently related to the original text. With the exception of technical or grammatical changes, the full text of any modified regulation will be available for 15 days prior to its adoption, and will be provided to those persons who have requested or are required to receive notification of regulatory actions, or who have provided written or oral comments relevant to the proposed regulatory action.

### **INFORMATIVE DIGEST**

The Chancellor's Office is proposing to adopt a permanent regulation conferring authority on the Chancellor in cases of a state declared emergency.

The COVID-19 pandemic beginning in March 2020 resulted in disruptions to the administration of the California Community Colleges, and in particular to the continuity of education for our students. To respond to these disruptions as quickly as possible and to ensure that quality instruction for students continued, the Board of Governors adopted an emergency regulation that authorized the Chancellor to take all appropriate actions, including by executive order, to allow the continued education of community college students during the period of emergency, including the temporary suspension of

regulations adopted by the Board and the suspension of related local rules and regulations that were a barrier to the continuity of educational services.

This emergency authority allowed the Chancellor's Office to take prompt action to address concerns that have arisen during the pandemic. However, under the Board's procedures, the Chancellor's emergency authority will expire after 180 days unless a permanent regulation is adopted at a regular meeting.

The continuing nature of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the possibility of future crises requiring the exercise of emergency powers, prompts the Chancellor's Office to recommend that the Board adopt the proposed permanent regulation conferring emergency authority on the Chancellor, to ensure the continuity of educational services. Accordingly, this proposed regulation is presented for consideration by the Board.

## **ESTIMATED COST OR SAVINGS OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS**

The estimated cost or savings of the proposed amendments are anticipated to be as follows:
