General Questions

Public Health Science 2.0 or Public Health

What is the difference between Public Health Science 2.0 and Public Health?

The Public Health TMC is the updated version and replacement for the Public Health Science TMC. The degree title has been changed to Public Health, so the "2.0" should not have been added when it was posted for colleges to use. Initially, there was a misunderstanding during the development of templates, which led to the addition of "2.0" to the CCCCO submission form. This has since been corrected, and the title is simply Public Health.

Accuracy of Chancellor's Office memo

Is the information in the CCCCO memo still valid?

Yes, the information in the memo is still accurate, except for the use of "2.0" in the title of degrees. Please follow the memo for guidance.

College submission for Public Health Science ADT

If a college already submitted a new degree with 2.0 in the title, will they need to submit it again to the CCCCO

No, campuses will not have to resubmit their proposal if they already submitted it with 2.0 in the title - the CCCCO will remove the 2.0 in COCI for those campuses.

Choice between Public Health and Public Health Science

Can campuses choose between the Public Health or the Public Health Science ADT and descriptors?

No, according to the CCCCO memo, the Public Health Science AS-T is being replaced with the Public Health AS-T. Colleges have 18 months from September 1, 2023, to submit a degree to the CCCCO that reflects the new Public Health version. Additionally, Public Health Science (PHS) descriptors are being "archived," and all currently approved PHS courses will need to be submitted to C-ID for the new Public Health (PH) descriptors.
