Vision 2030 envisions a higher education system more inclusive of all Californians that ensures access points for every learner, across race, ethnicity, region, class and gender to enter a pathway with tailored guidance to and through their academic journey.

Leading with equity

Vision 2030 will also lead with equity and change structures to create equitable opportunities and supports for students who need them the most. This will remain the central focus of California Community Colleges' work, and it is brought from theory to action in the roadmap's three goals: Equity in Success, Equity in Access and Equity in Support. Each goal not only stands on its own but represents one part of the overarching equity goals for the system to reduce and ultimately eliminate the equity gaps for each outcome below:

Equity in Success

Increase with equity the number of California Community Colleges students who:

- Complete a meaningful educational outcome.
- Attain a baccalaureate degree.
- Earn a living wage.

Equity in Access

Equitably increase the number of students attending a California community college, with particular emphasis on the number of underserved Californians.

Equity in Support

- Equitably increase the number of California Community Colleges students receiving state and federal aid for which they are eligible to better support their educational journey.
- Decrease the number of units in excess of 60 units for the Associate Degree for Transfer.
