RE: Accounting Advisory: Reappropriation of Strong Workforce Program and Student Success Completion Grant Funds

This accounting advisory provides information on the return of funds from districts for the 2020-21 Strong Workforce Program and 2022-23 Student Success Completion Grant Program.

Districts must verify available balances by Thursday, July 25, by completing the enclosed survey [Strong Workforce Program and Student Success Completion Grant: Balances Available for Reappropriation](#).

Reappropriation of Funds

The 2024 Budget Act reappropriates \$18.8 million in unspent 2020-21 Strong Workforce funds and \$21.3 million in unused 2022 Student Success Completion Grant funds, depending on the actual amounts available as of June 30, 2024. These funds have already been distributed to districts and regions; therefore, the Chancellor's Office will be returning these funds from districts through the apportionment process in September 2024 for reappropriation.

Districts must confirm balances available for reappropriation as of June 30, 2024, in coordination with Financial Aid Officers and management from the Strong Workforce Program and Regional Consortia. Please ensure accuracy, as the verified available balances will be returned to the Chancellor's Office as a component of the September 2024 apportionment payment.

The reappropriations will be reflected in Apportionment Exhibit A as a Prior Year Categorical Adjustment at the revised 2024-25 Advance Apportionment September 2024.

Background Program Information

Strong Workforce Program

The 2020 Budget Act provided \$235 million in Strong Workforce funding to all districts aiming to increase student enrollment in high-demand, high-wage job programs and improve program quality. This funding ensures more students complete their programs, transfer, find employment,

and increase their earnings. The funding is divided into 60% Local Share for each district and 40% Regional Share, with regional consortia focusing on the state's eight macro-economic regions.

Student Success Completion Grant Program

The 2022 Budget Act appropriated \$412.602 million in ongoing local assistance to support the Community College Success Completion Grant. This grant aims to support student persistence, retention, and success by providing students additional assistance to full-time community college students. This funding is direct aid to students.

Financial Reporting Considerations

Districts should consult their local accounting policies and confer with their contracted audit team to determine the appropriate treatment of the revenue reductions in their general ledger and for their 2023-24 financial statements. The net reduction in funds should be considered a payable to the Chancellor's Office.
