### **Digest Item 1.4: Compliance with the Fifty Percent Law**

### **Digest Item 1.5: State and Federal Update**

### **Digest Item 1.6: TOP to CIP Transition**

*(Vice Chancellor Cooper and Executive Vice Chancellor Ferguson)*

This digest item presented the use of Taxonomy of Programs (TOP) and changes associated with adopting a common course numbering system represent an ideal time to also move the California Community Colleges to a common classification system, CIP.

#### **Discussion Summary:**

- CCCAOE offered support for future work regarding this digest item.
- ASCCC echoed CCCAOE's offer of support.
- CCCCIO commended the work on this digest item.

## **Digest Item 1.7: Proposed Regulatory Action: Student Education Plans** *(Deputy Chancellor Tomaneng)*

This digest item presented proposed regulatory amendments to Title 5, Sections 55524, 55530 and 55531 aim to ensure timely student education planning.

### **Discussion Summary:**

- ASCCC emphasized the allocation of resources for counseling faculty providing course services.
- CCA/CTA raised concerns about student education plans, emphasizing the need to maximize their value and inquiring whether dual enrollment students would be exempt.
- SSCCC inquired about the course requirements included in the student education plans.
- FACCC commended the work on this digest item.
- CSSO provided feedback on technology needs, access, and faculty resource time commitment related to student education plans.
