**RE:** FY 2024-25 Nursing Enrollment Growth and Retention Grant – Additional Funding

The purpose of this memorandum is to announce the additional funding available for the Nursing Enrollment Growth and Retention Grant in the amount of \$920,894. These funds are available for colleges who had returned funds from previous fiscal years. The Chancellor's Office would like to re-allocate the funds during 2024-25 to continue the intent of the grant as outline in [Education Code Section 78261](#) with a focus on expansion of student nursing program cohorts, reducing attrition and increasing completion.

Funding allocations are based on the completion of the Nursing Enrollment Growth and Retention Grant application for 2024-25 and the following nursing performance metrics.

**Table 1: Nursing Performance Metrics**

Metric Type	Metric
Retention Rate	The overall retention rate of the program.
Completion Rate	The number of students who completed an ADN program.
National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) First time Pass rate	The number of students who passed their NCLEX exam on first attempt.

**The funds may be used to do the following**

Expand enrollment, provide diagnostic assessments and offer pre-entry coursework to prospective nursing students and diagnostic assessments and supportive services to enrolled nursing students. For purposes of this section, supportive services include, but are not limited to, tutoring, case management, mentoring and counseling services. Funds may also be used to develop alternative delivery models such as part-time, evening, weekend and summer program offerings [\[Education Code Section 78261\(d\)\]](#).

Funds will be distributed to the colleges in the P1 Apportionment schedule. These funds will follow the Nursing Enrollment Growth and Retention grant 2024-25 plan reporting structure and must be spent by June 30, 2026. To access the funds, the colleges will need to edit the 2024-25 plan in NOVA indicating how they plan to expend the additional funds. The colleges may begin using these reallocated funds beginning Jan. 1, 2025, based on the resubmission of the 2024-25 plan and approved by the [Regional Monitor](#).
