The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office – Division of Workforce and Economic Development, in partnership with the California Department of Education is pleased to formally announce the 2023-24 funding awards for the K12 Strong Workforce Program (SWP) Round 6B applications. The Regional Consortia was unable to fully allocate their K12 funds and conducted a second competitive grant application to redistribute any remaining funds, referred to as "Round Six B" to eligible grant recipients.
