RE: Updated Cal Grant Data Reporting Requirements (Senate Bill 70)

This memorandum outlines updates to Senate Bill 70 data reporting requirements for institutional participation in the Cal Grant program. Institutions should refer to the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) Special Alert [GSA 2025-46](#) for additional information.

Enrollment, Persistence, and Graduation Data

The [California Education Code Section 69433.2](#), amended by AB 123, requires that each Cal Grant participating institution, or the systemwide central office of the public postsecondary educational institution acting on behalf of the participating institution, reports the following data to the California Student Aid Commission annually by March 31:

- Enrollment, persistence, and graduation data for all students;
- Disaggregated by gender, ethnicity, Pell Grant status, first generation status, transfer status, student parent status, foster youth status; and
- Eligibility used of state financial aid received, including Cal Grant A, Cal Grant B, Cal Grant C, Cal Grant Access Awards, and Middle Class Scholarship.

The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office acting on behalf of participating California community colleges, will satisfy the reporting requirements for enrollment, persistence, and graduation data by submitting to the Cradle-to-Career Data System annually.

Job Placement, Salary, and Wage Data

In addition, [California Education Code Section 69433.2](#) requires participating institutions to report students' job placement rate, salary, and wage information for:

- Each program that is either designed or advertised to lead to a particular type of job; or
- Advertised or promoted with a claim regarding job placement.

Updated Cal Grant Data Reporting Requirements (Senate Bill 70)

March 24, 2026

The data available through the Chancellor's Office [Salary Surfer](#) website will meet the requirements and therefore colleges will not be required to submit additional job placement, salary, and wage information.
