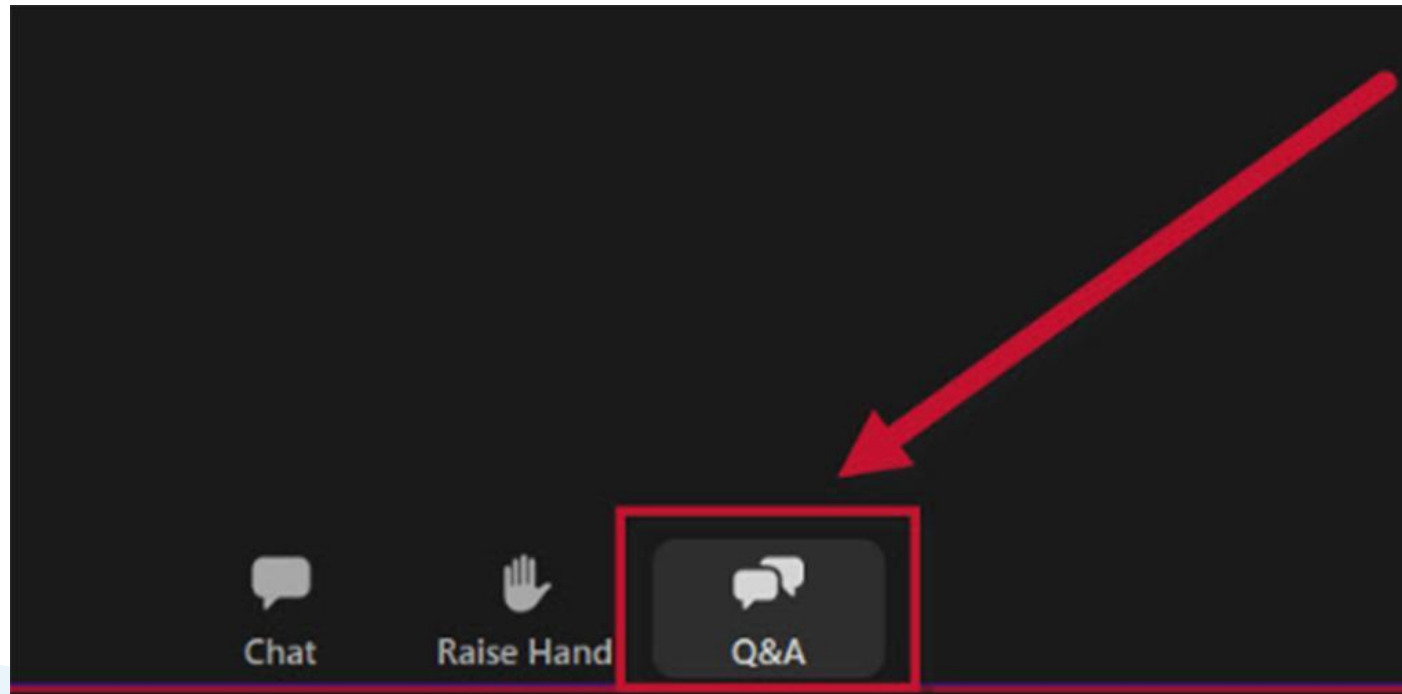

RSI vs FTES

Related and Supplemental Instruction (RSI) – classroom instruction component of an apprenticeship program that is funded by a specific state program.

RSI focuses on the dedicated funding for the classroom instruction part while FTES focuses on the college credit aspect of the apprenticeship training.

Full-Time Equivalent Student (FTES) – Community colleges funding mechanism, they can receive reimbursement for apprenticeship courses offered for college credit.

RSI vs FTES continue

Differences:

RSI funding is typically provided directly by the state to support the cost related instruction for apprentices, while FTES funding comes from the community college's apportionment based on the number of enrolled students in apprenticeship courses.

RSI is primarily concerned with the theoretical and supplemental knowledge needed for the apprenticeship trade, FTES focuses on the college credit earned through the apprenticeship coursework.

Not all apprenticeship programs are eligible for RSI funding, most college-based apprenticeship programs can potentially receive FTES funding if they offer courses for college credit.

Funding Strategies for Pre-Apprenticeship & Cont. Education Programs

State funding: Provide funding for startup for new programs, and other workforce investment. For example, CAI provides millions of dollars annually to support local and regional partnership.

Federal Funding: U.S. Department of Labor provides grants and contract opportunities for registered apprenticeship and non-registered programs. The DOL's State Apprenticeship System Building and Modernization program awards grants for pre-apprenticeship programs that lead to registered apprenticeship enrollment.

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA): Funds can be used to fund pre-apprenticeship programs and provide support to help participants obtain the skills needed to be placed into an apprenticeship.

Individual Training Accounts (ITAs): Can be used to fund the classroom instruction component of an apprenticeship program.

Philanthropic Foundations: Can be a source of funding for pre-apprenticeship and continuing education programs.
