Considerations

- Trades need apprentices in the field working (#1 Priority)
 - Trades want options for current and later pathways
 - Some trades need recruitment incentives like CPL (some don't)
 - Trade representatives are busy and can be tough to schedule in meetings with faculty (to confer on credit recommendations)
 - Sensitive to competing interests (find shared interests)
 - Overlap between APDP and other Demonstration Projects

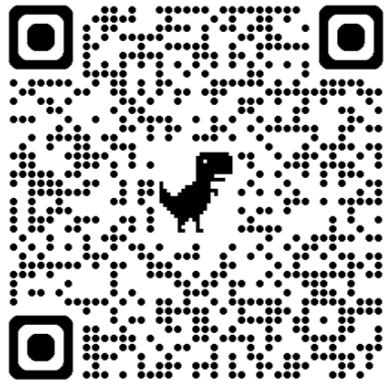

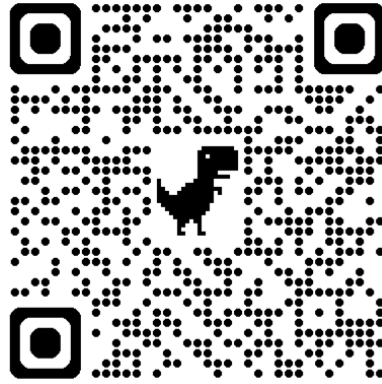
- **Organize:** Add a CPL Update to Senate and Executive Agendas -- Establish a CPL Team -- Review the Scaling CPL in California and training videos -- Review Recommended AP (4235) Credit for Prior Learning -- New Colleges, Complete MAP Implementation Form
- **Collect:** Gather sample CPL documents (certificates, JSTs, etc.) for veterans, working adults, apprentices
Submit JST Authorization to Batch Request from DoD.
- **Practice:** Meet with the MAP team to begin processing CPL – Drop In Zoom M-Th 11A-12 or Friday 9-10A



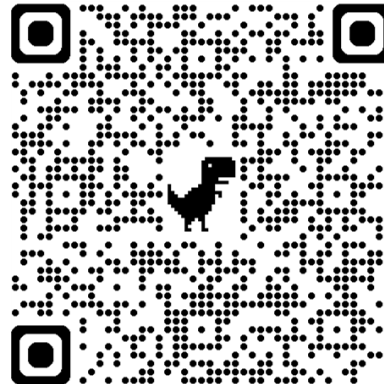

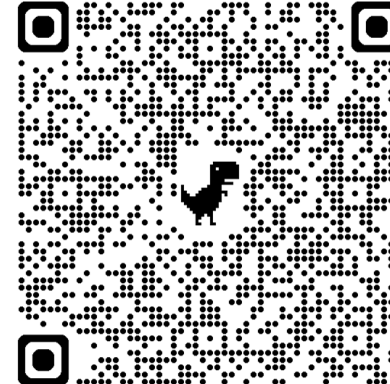

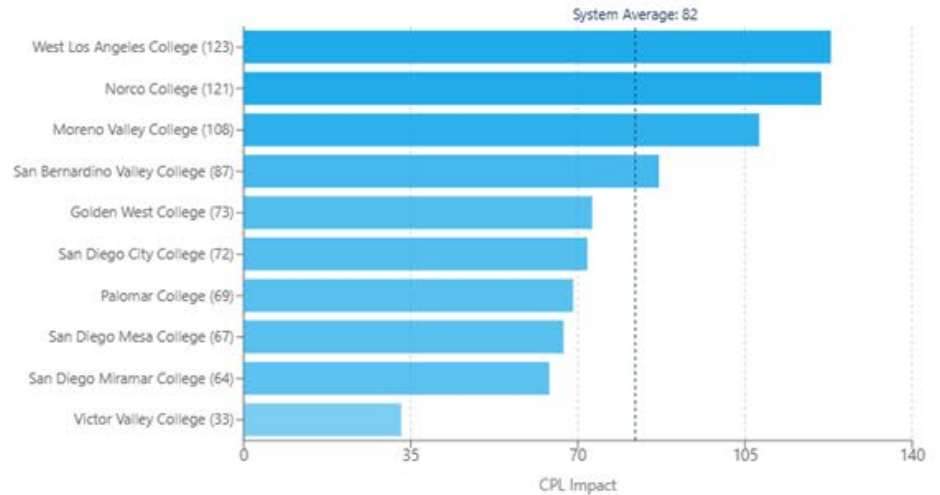

Top 10 Colleges by CPL Implementation Success



A college successfully scaling CPL should demonstrate high efficiency (6+ units per CPL student) while serving a meaningful student population (100+ students). The ideal implementation balances efficiency (high average CPL units per student) with impact (reaching many students), indicating robust processes and broad adoption of CPL opportunities. Scores are calculated taking these principles into consideration.
