BACKGROUND

The NextUp Program delivers essential academic, financial, health, and social support to 5,007 students with foster care experience across 115 California community colleges. Bolstered by increased funding in the 2022–2023 California Budget, the program has expanded to serve eligible foster youth students at every community college in the state. California Education Code 79226 requires the California Community Colleges Board of Governors to submit a biennial report on the NextUp Program. This report details efforts to support current and former foster youth and includes data on enrollment, retention, transfer, completion rates, and program funding.

Foster youth often lack caregivers who can assist with the complexities of college admissions and financial aid. Once enrolled, they frequently face limited access to critical resources such as stable housing and financial support. These barriers contribute to disproportionate rates of poverty, housing insecurity, and homelessness, which in turn negatively impact academic performance, credit accumulation, and eligibility for financial aid.

In response to these challenges, Senate Bill 1023 authorized the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (Chancellor's Office) to establish the NextUp Program, originally known as the Cooperating Agencies Foster Youth Educational Support (CAFYES). Subsequent legislation, including Senate Bill 12, Senate Bill 512, and Assembly Bill 190, has further expanded the program.

PROGRAM SERVICES

NextUp programs provide a comprehensive support system tailored to the unique needs of current and former foster youth. Outreach begins early, targeting K–12 and alternative schools, local resource family agencies, and county child welfare offices to support students in their transition to college.

With the recent college expansion, nearly every participating NextUp campus offers a dedicated space—or "center"—where students can study, use computers and printers, access food and snacks, connect with peers, receive personalized case management and wraparound services and support from dedicated NextUp program staff. Throughout the semester, students meet regularly with staff and academic counselors to receive individualized services, including college transition planning, financial aid assistance, and guidance on course selection and post-college and career goals.

Beyond academic support, NextUp offers a range of essential resources to address students' basic needs. These include food stipends, transportation vouchers, housing assistance, childcare subsidies, and textbook funding. Students also have access to health and mental health services, housing navigation, independent living skills training, and legal support—ensuring they are equipped to succeed both inside and outside the classroom.

OUTCOME DATA

This report presents systemwide outcomes for NextUp students, as reported by colleges to the Chancellor's Office Management Information System (MIS). In the 2022-23 academic year, 3,052 students were served through NextUp across 115 community colleges; that number grew to 5,007 in the 2023-24 academic year. Across multiple key metrics, current and former foster youth participating in NextUp are demonstrating improved academic outcomes and greater success in college.

ENROLLMENT IN CREDIT COURSES

In recent years, credit enrollment rates among NextUp students have remained steady at approximately 96% across both academic years. As shown in the table below, the total number of students enrolled in credit courses increased by 1,864, likely due to the program's expansion to additional community colleges. This growth has coincided with continued strong academic performance among NextUp participants. Students have consistently succeeded in completing both credit and transfer-level English and math courses. The table also highlights steady trends in course completion rates, including a 2 percent increase in the percentage of students completing nine or more units during the fall term.

FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid remains a critical support for students with foster care experience in the California Community Colleges system. Participants in the NextUp program have consistently received financial aid at higher and more reliable rates compared to foster youth who are not enrolled in the program. Recent data show that more NextUp students are accessing these essential financial aid resources. Between the 2022–23 and 2023–24 academic years, the percentage of Pell Grant recipients among NextUp students increased by 1%, while the rate of California College Promise Grant (CCPG) recipients remained steady, as illustrated in the tables below. Access to financial aid is strongly correlated with positive academic outcomes among NextUp students. These resources alleviate financial stress, allowing students to focus more fully on their coursework rather than worrying about basic needs such as housing,

food, and transportation. For foster youth, who often lack family financial support, financial aid can be the determining factor between persisting in college or dropping out. By covering educational and living expenses, financial aid helps level the playing field, empowering foster youth to succeed academically and make meaningful progress toward their educational goals. The availability of financial aid allows foster youth to focus more on their studies by reducing financial stress. These resources help cover tuition, textbooks, and living expenses, which can otherwise be significant barriers to academic progress. Without financial aid, many foster youth would be forced to choose between working multiple jobs and attending college, often resulting in lower academic performance or even discontinuation of their education. With adequate support from NextUp, foster youth students are better equipped to thrive in college, graduate, and achieve long-term success. Thus, financial aid is not just a benefit but a necessity for foster youth to achieve their full potential in higher education.

ENROLLMENT IN 9+ UNITS

As shown in the table below, the percentage of NextUp students enrolling in nine or more units remained steady compared to the previous academic year. This is particularly significant given that NextUp foster youth often encounter substantial challenges, such as housing instability, limited financial resources, and lack of academic support, that can make it difficult to take on a full course load. Notably, among those who did enroll in nine or more units, the course completion rate increased by 2%, reflecting improved academic outcomes for students who are able to sustain a higher unit load. The NextUp program plays a critical role in supporting these students by providing tailored academic assistance designed to address their unique needs. Through services such as personalized counseling, tutoring, priority registration, and textbook support, NextUp helps foster youth stay on track and succeed in their coursework. These resources not only ease the burden of managing a full academic schedule but also empower students to build the confidence and stability needed to achieve their educational and career goals.

CREDIT AND TRANSFER-LEVEL ENGLISH

Many NextUp students require academic support that goes beyond standard educational counseling to succeed in their coursework. Recent data highlights encouraging trends in both enrollment and completion of credit-bearing and transfer-level English courses between the 2022–23 and 2023–24 academic years. As shown in the table below, enrollment and successful completion rates for credit English courses among NextUp students have remained stable

across academic years. Similarly, enrollment and completion rates in transfer-level English courses have also remained consistent. These steady outcomes suggest that the academic support provided by the NextUp program, such as tutoring, individualized counseling, and targeted skill-building, plays a critical role in helping students meet the demands of college-level English coursework and stay on track for degree completion or transfer.

CREDIT AND TRANSFER-LEVEL MATH

As shown in the table below, NextUp students have maintained consistent enrollment rates in credit-bearing math courses. The table below further highlights continued academic success, with a 1% increase in enrollment in transfer-level math courses, indicating growing confidence and preparedness among NextUp students. Most notably, this data reveals a 1% increase in the successful completion of transfer-level math courses compared to previous academic years, an encouraging sign of academic progress in this foundational subject. These gains reflect the impact of the NextUp program's comprehensive support services, which include specialized math tutoring, personalized academic planning, and enhanced access to resources that help foster youth students build the skills needed to succeed in challenging coursework.

PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION EFFORTS

Since the 2022-23 academic year, the NextUp Program has undergone extensive implementation efforts at the local level. Through a historic investment in California's foster youth, the Chancellor's Office has successfully expanded and fully implemented the program by allocating funding to all California community colleges for two consecutive fiscal years.

In 2023-24, the Chancellor's Office hosted a community of practice in collaboration with advocates and practitioners at colleges that previously lacked foster youth support infrastructure. These sessions fostered peer learning and covered a wide range of critical topics, including program overview, dependency status, community partnerships, case management, student interventions, support for LGBTQ+ foster youth, Foster Care Awareness Month initiatives, commencement and summer services support, and outreach and recruitment strategies that impact the NextUp program.

To further strengthen program visibility, the Chancellor's Office developed key marketing and outreach materials reflecting recent legislative changes, expansion efforts, and program implementation. These materials were integrated into the agency's ICAN Campaign to help increase awareness and connect eligible foster youth to NextUp services.

Ongoing statewide outreach remains a priority, with continued collaboration between the Chancellor's Office and NextUp program staff and administrators. Through professional development opportunities and the sharing of best practice models, colleges are better equipped to implement the program effectively and reach as many foster youth students as possible.

Finally, Appendix A demonstrates the total 2022-23 and 2023-24 NextUp program allocations illustrating the NextUp program has expanded to 115 colleges.

POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS

The Chancellor's Office recommends that programs place a strong emphasis on student outreach, growth, and retention by expanding the wraparound support services and individualized case management. These efforts provided by NextUp aim to address students' holistic needs – academic, social, and emotional – through proactive outreach, consistent

support, and access to critical resources. By integrating these supports, NextUp colleges are better equipped to help foster youth students stay on track and achieve their educational goals.
