We have encouraged community colleges and high schools to form dual enrollment partnerships to ensure seamless transitions between both systems. Under state law, undocumented high school students do not have to pay nonresident tuition if they are dual enrolled at a community college. They can use these college courses to meet AB 540 eligibility.

Anonymous Attendee	The board of barbering and cosmetology application requires a SSN or ITIN, how would someone bypass that questions?	Hello. There is currently no way to bypass that question; however, undocumented immigrants can qualify for an ITIN and apply for these professions. They do not need a SSN.
Anonymous Attendee	Please also apply to programs such as EOPS/EOP for financial and academic support!	Social security numbers are not required for EOPS, financial aid or academic support. If you need assistance, please go to the Dream Resource Center and financial aid office. Please feel free to ask questions until you understand the process.
