Proposed Questions for Panelists' Consideration and Response

- 1. If the NCAA, NJCAA, and NAIA were to remove restrictions on monetization of Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL) rights for athletes, how important would it be for the California community college system to implement similar new rules or policies?
- 2. How do you perceive opportunities for college athlete NIL monetization differing between athletes attending colleges in urban markets vs. rural markets? What about large colleges vs. small colleges (in terms of student body population)?
- 3. If California's community colleges were to relax restrictions on athlete compensation for use of their NIL in marketing and third-party endorsements, what aspects of proposed rules for NCAA Div. II, Div. III and NAIA would be relevant or most applicable in the context of CCC athletics? See resource links to NCAA NIL website and NAIA NIL website.
- 4. If California community colleges were included under SB 206 and restrictions on college athlete NIL compensation were relaxed, would oversight of permissible NIL activities be best situated

- within (a) athletics; (b) central administration; (c) CCCAA; (d) conferences; or (e) other such as a third party administrator?
- 5. What new educational or professional development opportunities should be made available for college athletes if they were able to engage in NIL marketing activities?
- 6. What are the primary ways in which we can enable CCC college athletes to retain eligibility at the next level of their education if California community college athletes were included under SB 206?
