



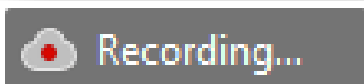

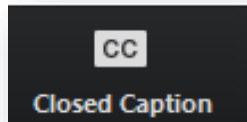

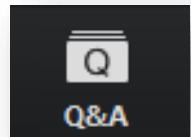

State Advocacy Overview

206 bills that have an impact on higher education.

76 bills classified as **Tier 1** and most likely to have a direct impact on the CCCs, faculty, and students.

February 17: Bill introduction deadline.

Policy committee hearings will begin in **March**.

Chancellor's Office Sponsored Bills

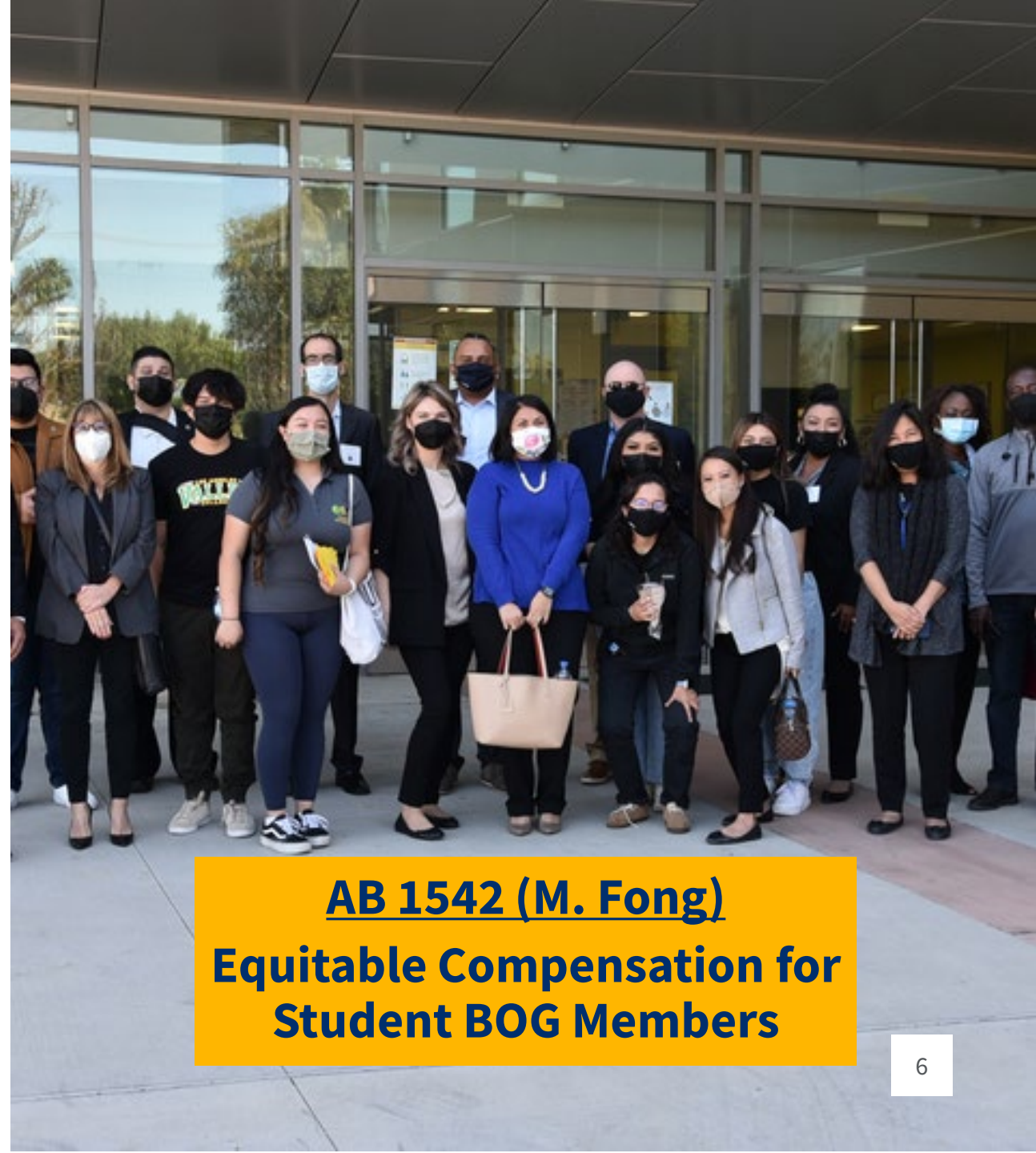
Would allow students who complete 60 units or an associate degree for transfer at a California Community College to satisfy certain AB 540 requirements.



AB 680 (Rubio)
**Streamlining AB 540
Transfer Pathways**

Chancellor's Office Sponsored Bills

Increases the compensation of the two student members serving on the Board of Governors from \$100 per meeting to \$4,000 per semester.

Modernization**

Chancellor's Office Sponsored Bills

Modernizes the Economic and Workforce Development Program to prioritize equitable student outcomes, work-based learning, and career and economic mobility.

Legislation with Potentially Significant Costs

- **AB 91 (Alvarez):** Nonresident tuition exemption.
 - ~\$8 million ongoing.
- **AB 260 (Santiago):** Part-time faculty compensation.
 - ~\$300 million ongoing.
- **AB 634 (Ward):** CDCP census-based attendance accounting.
 - ~\$20 million ongoing.
- **AB 1190 (Irwin):** Part-time faculty office hours.
 - ~\$25 million ongoing.
- **AB 1390 (McCarty):** UC/CSU service learning graduation requirement.
 - ~\$20 million one-time/ongoing.



Part-Time Faculty Health Insurance Program



Part-Time Faculty Health Insurance Survey

Per statute, survey is due March 1
Districts may request an extension
to April 1 - by Monday, February 27

All districts must submit a
survey response in order to
receive COVID-19 Recovery
Block Grant funds.

Districts must survey their
part-time faculty prior to
completing the survey.

Updates to Frequently Asked Questions

Part-time instructors, librarians, and counselors are eligible to participate in the program.

Any district which has established an eligible program meeting the four requirements for 100% reimbursement at any time during the fiscal year, may submit a claim on June 1 of that fiscal year for up to 100% reimbursement of annual costs.

Classified School Employee Summer Assistance Program Update

Important Dates

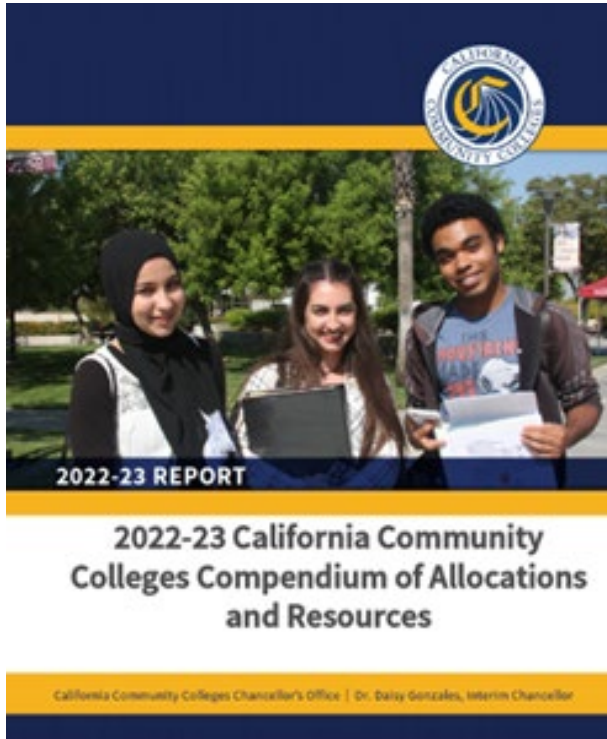
- March 1 – Classified employees notify their districts they have elected to participate in the program for 2023-24.
- March 31 – All districts must notify the Chancellor’s Office whether they will participate.
- May 1 - Chancellor’s Office notifies participating districts of the estimated state match funding that classified employees can expect to receive.
- June 1 - Participating districts notify participating classified employees of the amount of estimated state match funds that a participating classified employee can expect to receive in 2023-24.
- Summer 2024 – Participating employees receive payment and matching funds.
