

NEWLY DESIGNED, STUDENT-FOCUSED CALIFORNIA COLLEGE PROMISE GRANT APPLICATION LAUNCHES TODAY

The California Community Colleges provides tuition and fee waivers to nearly one million students through the California College Promise Grant. But far too many students still think they are not eligible for financial aid or don't know how to start the process and don't apply as a result. The Chancellor's Office and its <u>Student Centered Design Lab</u> has redesigned the California College Promise Grant application to help

remove student barriers to access financial aid. The simplified tuition and fee waiver application takes about half the time to complete.

According to Danielle R., a student at El Camino College who tested the new form, "If there were more documents like that—simple, straight to the point—I feel like a lot of people would submit their documents on time instead of waiting until the last minute, or not even doing it at all."

The simplified California College Promise Grant application has been reduced from four pages to two pages, and includes more student-friendly language and a clearer pathway guiding students to completion. Additionally, colleges may add customized information including a college or district logo, submission instructions and contact information for the financial aid office. Once customized, the simplified application can be used immediately for the 2020-2021 academic year.

The new PDF application is available now in English and Spanish and the <u>online version within CCCApply</u> is being updated this fall. Board of Governors

The California Community Colleges <u>Board of Governors</u> met <u>this week</u> and added three new members. Gov. Gavin Newsom over the weekend signed legislation adding Lt. Gov.
