Subject: Strong Workforce Program - Local Share System - 2016-17 Funds

In concert with yesterday's action by the Board of Governors that approved the Strong Workforce Program district and regional allocations for 2016-17, the Workforce and Economic Development Division has launched the Local Share System for use by districts to report their use of Strong Workforce Local Shares. This statewide system can be found at <a href="http://swplocal.cccco.edu">http://swplocal.cccco.edu</a>. The Local Share System pertains to the sixty percent of the Strong Workforce funds apportioned directly to community college districts. The deadline to report of use of Local Shares is January 31, 2017.

Each district may obtain the usernames and passcodes for itself and each of its college by submitting a request to the <a href="StrongWorkforcehelpdesk@cccco.edu">StrongWorkforcehelpdesk@ccco.edu</a>. As Strong Workforce funds are apportioned directly to community college districts per statute, colleges will need to go through their district to get a username and passcode. Any other questions about the Local Share System can also be submitted to <a href="StrongWorkforcehelpdesk@cccco.edu">StrongWorkforcehelpdesk@cccco.edu</a>.

Funds apportioned directly to a community college district shall be expended for the purpose of funding regionally prioritized projects and programs within the community college district that meet the needs of local and regional economies, as identified in regional plans and the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.

The companion Regional Share System is under development and targeted for release mid-October as is outlined in the Master Calendar.
