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Background and Vision



- AB 1111 Common Course Numbering Task Force (Sept. 2022 Dec. 2023)
 - Intersegmental and cross-function membership
 - Report and Recommendations (2023)
- Common Course Numbering Project
 - Task: Implement recommendations from Task Force
 - Plan to use a phased approach for development of templates and student-facing implementation
- Vision of system-level articulation from community colleges to universities using CCN Course Templates for:
 - Common transferability from all CCCs
 - Common General Education applicability from all CCCs
 - Consistent course-to-course articulation from all CCCs

CCN Phase I




- Some colleges have received Cal-GETC denials
 - Need to resubmit mid-December with Part 2 adjustment on course outlines
 - Template revision in Spring 2026
- Gathering feedback on the CCN aligned courses
 - Inconsistent Data in ASSIST
 - CCN related mistakes have consequential articulation and transferability data implications for students
 - Honors and Embedded Support Templates not required but need a part

4.2 Launch of Common Course Numbering

Added interface to input and modify templates

Introduced *Course Type* to course form

Added workflow to course form to support adoption of common courses

4.3 Launch of Course Outline of Record as Structured Data & Common Course Numbering v2

COR as document upload retired for Credit Courses

Narrative response fields added to default course form

Part 2 fields added to course form when course type is updated to Common

CIP Code added to courses form as required field *for all course modifications and new submissions regardless of CB04 response*.



COR Fields Added for Credit Courses Only

Required Fields

- Course Content, Required Topics
- Objectives/Outcomes
- Examples of Instructional Methodology
- Methods of Evaluation
- Representative Texts, Manuals, and/or OER that is equivalent, Other Support Materials
- Examples of Reading and Writing

A Few Notes on CIP Codes...

→ While the CIP Code is now required for all course submissions, we recognize that not all course will have them assigned when course modifications in flight are ready to be submitted.

→ Users should select *Unknown 99.9999* to proceed with submitting courses that were recently reviewed and approved within your local process.

→ The field does not currently have a CB data element number and will not trigger the substantial change workflow when edited.

Articulation is Essential to CCN

- AB1111 makes CCN a shared system obligation to streamline transfer.
- There are unintended consequences of implementing CCN absent aligned transferability and articulation.
- Current articulation is confusing for students.
 - Inequitable, with students losing credits, repeating coursework, and extending their time to degree unnecessarily.
- CCN is not just a project—it's infrastructure.
 - Like broadband or transit, CCN is the statewide infrastructure that enables academic mobility. It should be treated as foundational—not discretionary—for any institution serving transfer students.





Benefits for Articulation Reform: Student Equity and Success

- Consistent articulation reduces students credit loss and excess units and closes equity gaps.
- Students attend multiple CCCs and/or preparing for multiple four-year destinations. Approximately 45% of Associate degree completers take courses at two or more CCCs.
- Speeding up transfer accelerates degree completion and workforce entry.
- Reduces financial aid waste and taxpayer-funded inefficiencies.
- Provides the state with a clearer, more scalable path to closing degree attainment gaps.
