

# SYSTEM WEBINAR SUMMARY (Dec. 2023): CELEBRATING 2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

This webinar focused on Celebrating Courageous Leadership across the California Community Colleges and our accomplishments in 2023. Guest presenters included Cassandra Flandre-Nguyen, SSCCC; Cheryl Aschenbach, ASCCC; Wendy Brill-Wynkoop, FACCC; Eric Ramones, ACCCA/ACHRO; Mark Sanchez and Zaneta Salde Encarnacion, Southwestern College.

### What are Key Accomplishments of Consultation Council Members in 2023?

- SSCCC: Remarkable turnout of ~400 students at recent <u>Advocacy Academy</u> event and significant strengthening of our connections with students across the system.
- ASCCC: Ongoing commitment to Inclusive Diversity, Equity, Access, and Accountability (IDEAA), establishing <u>Strategic Directions 2023-2026</u>, collaborating with intersegmental partners on <u>CalGETC</u> and <u>transfer alignment</u>, delivering highimpact professional learning events, and planning for many <u>more</u> in 2024 to support Vision 2030.
- FACCC: Sponsored successful legislation that adds MESA to statute and increases funding (<u>SB 444</u>) and removed barriers for students who use an ITIN (<u>SB 467</u>), and planning to support Vision 2030 through offering scholarships for the <u>Great Teachers Seminar</u> and our <u>legislative advocacy</u>.
- ACCCA/ACHRO: Enhanced our partnerships with many groups, focused on a
   <u>pipeline</u> for faculty and staff to become administrators, intentional efforts to
   <u>embed DEIA</u> in our programs and conference, developed a Social Justice Career
  Advancement Program (information to come!), and helped with EEO diversity
   efforts including training modules.

#### What are Some Key Opportunities Systemwide for 2024?

- The state of our system is strong, but the state of our untapped opportunity is even stronger 80% of high school students not yet in dual enrollment, 6.8 million Californians with high school diploma but no college degree are just two examples.
- It's the era of partnerships, and we're mobilized to work with industry, labor and nonprofits to bring education and career training to those who need them most.
- Well positioned to play a central role in climate action, a leadership role in strengthening the care economy, and engaging fully in generative AI.

#### How is Southwestern College Approaching Vision 2030?

- Positive things are happening spring enrollment is up and so is Pell Grant receipt/disbursal; expect to exceed pre-pandemic enrollment by fall 2024.
- The college is participating in San Diego Regional EDC's <u>2030 Inclusive Growth</u> <u>Framework</u> focused on adding 20,000 skilled workers per year to the region's talent supply through investing in Latino and Black student success.
- The college is focused on challenging our systems and structures we've been using for a long time that have not been working to achieve progress for students of color.
- Partnerships are a big part of our efforts to achieve regional goals, including the
   <u>University Now Initiative</u> in partnership with the City of Chula Vista, employers, and
   education partners to identify the academic programs needed to meet regional
   workforce demand using the <u>Talent Pipeline Management</u> model.
- The initiative includes strategic partnerships with <u>public</u> and <u>private</u> universities to increase bachelor's degree options for our students. We are identifying opportunities to create needed programs that do not exist through collaborations or our own baccalaureate degree programs.
- AB 91 offers new options for our bi-national region and for cross-border educational partnerships and international learning experiences for our students.
- The college is working to maximize financial aid and reduce units to completion, including a partnership with <u>National University</u> for a free bachelor's degree with ADT and a <u>partnership with Sweetwater USD</u> on STEM Early College dual enrollment.
