- Strategic Planning is subordinate to the process of Strategic Thinking.
- Education Strategic Planning ensures that the correct mission, goals, values, & needs are used in identified strategic strategies.
- Strategic Planning Includes: Scoping, Data Collection, Planning, Implementation & Evaluation.



Planning Phase - Strategic Planning

- Identify matches and mismatches: integrating vision, beliefs, needs and current mission.
- Reconcile differences
- Identify and select preferred future
- Identify mission
- Identify SWOTS Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities & Threats
- Derive Decision Rules
- Develop Strategic Action Plan
